- 2. But you won't face your troubles alone, because Jesus said, "I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Mt 28:20)
- 3. And though they may be great, God will make sure they are not too much for you to bear with his strength, for "God is faithful, who will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear." (1 Co 10:13)
- 4. And even if the crops fail and the economy tanks, you can trust that he who taught us to ask him, "Give us each day our daily bread," will provide what you need for as long as he plans to keep you down here.
- 5. And each day his mercy to you in Christ will be there, and every time you turn back to him, his forgiveness in Christ will be there. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." … "My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defense- Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins." (1 John 1:9 & 2:1-2)
- 6. And if anyone who trusts in Christ, whether your parent, grandparent, child, friend, or you yourself- comes to the end of your earthly life before 2022 is done- you or they will "depart and be with Christ, which is better by far," than life on this present earth in the body. (Philippians 1:23)
- 7. But as long as you are still alive here, each day, the Lord will give you and every other Christian worthwhile ways to serve and praise him and bless others, for you are "God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God has prepared in advance for us to do."
- 8. And if Jesus' Second Coming happens and suddenly brings 2022 and this world to an end, as long as you are trusting in him as your Savior, you don't have to be afraid, but when you see Jesus coming in the sky, you can "stand up and lift up your heads, for your redemption is drawing near." (Lk 21:28)
- 9, For the reason he came the first time and went to the cross was to "save his people from their sins". (Mt 1:21)
- 10. So as you look ahead to 2022, do so with the attitude God's word says we can have in Hebrews 13:5-6: "God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.' So we say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?

Jesus Lives! God is Awesome! Psalm 77:14 (EHV) You are the God who performs a wonderful deed. You made known your power among the peoples.

It's daybreak." Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." 27 Then he said to him, "What is your name?" He said, "Jacob." 28 Then he said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have fought with God and with men, and you have won." 29 Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." He said, "Why do you ask what my name is?" Then he blessed him there.

Goals are work. God gave us so many blessings for us to use. Our time, talents, and treasures are the gifts He has given. How we use them is up to us. How did we spend time? How do we use our talents? How do we use our treasure? Our God gives us the choice as to how and when to use them. The Gospel drives us to use our gifts to the glory of God. The Law tells us how to use our gifts. The first we will wrestle with how, the second we are told how. Goals are work when we wrestle on how to use our gifts to glorify God.

Goals need perseverance. How long did Jacob wrestle? All night. Do you wrestle with weight? I do. It is hard to stay healthy when you wrestle with yourself as to what to eat. When it comes to myself, I don't wrestle much. The wrestling comes in when I see my wife and girls, and I would like to see them as long as God allows. What drives you to meet your goals? Are you willing to suffer and persevere? Jacob was blessed and so will we when we persevere in our goals.

Goals provide unexpected blessings. Losing weight would definitely do that. Not only do the joints feel better, but also your energy rises, you minimize your medications, your mood improves, etc. What was Jacob's blessing? His name stands throughout generations as the one who wrestled God and won. God blessed the world through Jacob. His name is Jesus - the same Jesus that we just celebrated his birth last month, and the same Jesus we will be celebrating at the empty tomb in a few months. These blessings not only were for Jacob and his family, but also for all generations since Jacob and will continue until Jesus comes back in glory on the Last Day. God is awesome!

St. John's Lutheran School has had the blessing of wrestling with the goal of "making disciples of all nations." This requires much work, great perseverance, and we will embrace the blessings that come with it.
